

TUGGERAH LAKES FIELD ARCHERS INC (TLFA) MEMBERS COMPETITION AWARD SCHEME 2025

RULES

- 1. Club competitions will be held monthly from February to November inclusive.
- 2. Competitions will be held on a Sunday except in special circumstances.
- 3. There are two competition levels.

 Competition A consists of two rounds

 Competition B consists of one round
- 4. Participants must nominate which competition (A or B) they will compete in prior to their first competition shoot of each season, i.e., Unmarked Safari or Field.
- 5. Participants in **competition B must shoot the morning round of the Unmarked Safari** competition (i.e. 2 arrow shoot).
- 6. Participants in competition B may shoot the morning or afternoon round of the Field competition. If shooting the afternoon round they must be at the club by 11.30am.
- 7. If a member nominates to shoot competition A and for any reason only shoots one round on any given competition day the score for that round is entered as a full competition score.
- 8. Five Unmarked Safari competitions will be held throughout the year.
- 9. Five Field competitions will be held throughout the year.
- 10. An archer's three (3) highest scores in either the Unmarked Safari competition or the Field competition will be used to calculate award recipients for either type of competition. This rule applies to both competition A or competition B.
- 11. Hosted competitions on the club grounds will be counted towards awards on the same basis as club competitions.

AWARDS

DIVISIONAL PLACES

Trophies will be awarded in all age and equipment divisions for the Unmarked Safari (A and B) competition or the Field (A and B) competition [maximum three (3) places]. If there is only one competitor in any division, provided they have recorded three (3) scores, as per #11 above, a medal will be awarded.

EQUIPMENT DIVISIONS

Compound sighted / unsighted; Recurve sighted / unsighted and Traditional i.e. long bow

AGE DIVISIONS

Joeys up to 9 years
Cubs 10 to 12 years
Cadets 13 to 15 years
Juniors 16 to 17 years

Open 18+ Veterans 60+

MOST IMPROVED

A badge will be awarded for the greatest improvement, over all divisions, in each type of competition from the first score recorded in 2025 and consistency of shooting. To be eligible for this award the required number of competitions must be completed.

NOMINATING TO SHOOT UP A DIVISION

At their first competition cubs, cadets or juniors can apply, in writing, to shoot in a higher age division for the year. Nominations must be approved by the club coach, the score recorder and have parental consent.

NB If approval is given then the archer must shoot in the higher division for the entire competition year. Forms are available from the Secretary.

CHANGE OF AGE DURING YEAR

When an archer's age division changes during the year due to their birth date the following applies:

- a) if the archer's birthday is **before 1 July**, then the archer is to shoot in the age division that they will be in as of that birthday. For example, an archer in the Cub division turns 13 before the 1 July then that archer shoots as a Cadet.
- b) if the archer's birthday is **after 1 July**, then the archer must nominate at **their first competition** the age division for the year. For example, an archer turns 13 after **1 July** then that archer can choose to shoot as a Cub or a Cadet.

This decision carries through for the competition year until awards are given.

CHANGE OF EQUIPMENT DURING COMPETITION YEAR

For example, if an archer begins the competition year in an unsighted division, then changes to a sighted division during the competition year, the scores in the unsighted division will cease. However, if the archer has accrued the appropriate number of scores in the unsighted division before the change, then he/she would be eligible for a trophy in that division.

Similarly, if the type of bow is changed during the competition year, e.g., from recurve to compound bow.
